
Angelwood's First Group Home Receives "Builders Care"

Thanks to the generosity of Builders Care- the charitable arm of the Northeast Florida Builders Association (NEFBA), and the friends and family of Builders Care board member John Molyneaux, our group home for young women received an amazing "facelift" in 7 days!!

After 13 years of being home to a number of children and young adults with disabilities, the house on Cheatham Trail was showing signs of wear and tear. Although some minor adaptations had been made after the house was purchased by Angelwood, the structure was not built to be wheelchair-friendly, presenting some challenges for two young women who use wheelchairs and walkers.

From demolition to placing the final touches of décor, it was incredible to watch the miracles happen at warp speed. Not only is the house beautiful, but it is safer and more accessible for all of the ladies who live there. The sunken living room was raised to make the house all one level and the bathrooms were enlarged with handicap fixtures installed. Another major part of this project was the addition of another bedroom to help us provide more respite for area families that need a place for their daughter to stay for a few hours or even a week.

John Molyneaux and Builders Care raised funds and resources to help make this tremendous project happen.
