

Here at Angelwood, we are so fortunate to have tremendous volunteer support throughout the year. Our volunteers help support all programs Angelwood offers to our local community, from hosting special classes for our individuals attending the Career Development & Education Center to basic home maintenance projects in any of our five group homes. Whether you are interested in volunteering by yourself or as a group of up to 40 people, we have an opportunity for you!

Holly Thomas, a local artist, has been volunteering with Angelwood since March 2023. Holly spends her time at Angelwood teaching individuals attending the Career Development & Education Center new art techniques including painting, working with different mediums, and creating seasonal projects. "I have loved volunteering at Angelwood and working with the individuals; it has become my favorite day of the week! The groups get to design awesome projects around the facility that they can be proud of, as well as inspiring others to be creative!"





Angelwood is proud to have partnered with volunteers from Duetsche Bank for over six years for an annual day of service. Michael Cunha, Production Support Analyst at Duetsche Bank, has led the day of service for the last three years. "It's been a pleasure to help coordinate the day of service to ensure the people in Angelwood programs receive the necessary improvements to their Group Homes and Regency Campus," says Michael. "We are looking forward to next year's project to continue to improve the quality of life of the individuals that Angelwood serves."

Wolfson High School's National Honor Society (NHS) recently held a day of service at Angelwood, where students spent time cleaning up the Sensory Garden, creating a pathway to make the garden wheelchair accessible, and refreshing many indoor spaces at the Regency Campus. Jane Courtney Davis, who oversees this program at Wolfson High School, started an initiative at the school to increase the involvement of other groups, including the chorus, band, Interact club, National Honor Society, and National Science Honor's Society, with the hopes of increasing involvement school-wide. "Wolfson NHS members had a wonderful day working around the campus. Our students enjoyed having the opportunity to support Angelwood. Wolfson hopes to build upon this experience especially as Angelwood launches the new thrift store. Angelwood significantly impacts the lives of so many, and we are excited to partner with such a special organization."

Jake (pictured back row left) first learned about Angelwood's Adult Day Training (ADT) program after hearing about it from a former Angelwood employee when he moved to Jacksonville. Jake and his mom Carrie took a tour of the ADT and both really liked what was offered. Since Jake started attending the program he said he most enjoys painting and stamping. His mother said, "The staff at the ADT are so friendly and helpful! Jake is my world, and I am so happy that he is safe and watched over while attending the ADT. Judy is a ROCK STAR and answers all my questions!" Jake also attends events through the Angelwood Community Explorers (ACE) program and has participated in golf, bowling, a zoo trip, and other outings. Carrie said that Jake usually spends most of his time with her but now thoroughly enjoys socializing with peers at ACE events and has started making friends here in Jacksonville through ACE and the ADT. Judy Markowycz, Career Development and Education Director notes, "Jake is very friendly and easy going and we enjoy having him at the ADT! He loves interacting with peers at all of the ACE events."

Amanda came to live at an Angelwood group home over 20 years ago as a high school student, and now also attends Angelwood's Career Development & Education Center. Amanda enjoys shopping and picking out her own things, both going to the movies and watching them at home with her housemates. She also loves to bake. At the Career Development & Education Center Amanda enjoys crafts, participating in tennis, and is a member of the Rising Stars Special Olympics Basketball team.

Amanda underwent surgery a year ago and was unable to put any weight on her right leg. "Through her strong determination in physical therapy, she has made incredible strides! She now safely ambulates with her walker through the halls. She is regularly encouraged by staff as they celebrate her progress," said Lisa Fortune, Physical Therapist.

Senior Program Director, Kenya Daniels, has known Amanda since she first came to live at Angelwood. She shared, "Amanda has always been very independent and sociable and enjoys the friends she has through Angelwood as well as other friends she has made in the community. She is an excellent self-advocate and makes sure she communicates her wants and needs. She always keeps a positive can-do attitude and brightens any room she enters!"
