

However, there is a group of parents who experience this milestone very differently. When people living with a developmental disability reach the age of 22 they ageout of school. If this sounds ominous, it is. At school transition meetings, parents are encouraged to connect with Vocational Rehabilitation and the Agency for Persons with Disabilities for adult services for their child. But the process is cumbersome and time consuming, often with extended wait times, applications denied, and a lot of fear for parents. What will happen to my child? This can cause parents to feel overwhelmed in the process and by the fact that their next steps in life will forever include their adult child who will always need them. Angelwood helps parents meet some of their needs through our Group Homes, Adult Day Training (ADT) program and Employment Services.

Sometimes a person's needs are beyond Angelwood's scope of practice. Other times we are simply at capacity. Regardless, we are happy to listen to their concerns, share resources, and help families know what to expect from a program for their loved one. Helping a family navigate their journey is sometimes just as important as providing the actual service. Group Home

Each of Angelwood's five group homes is located in neighborhoods around Jacksonville. The residents have the opportunity to be part of their community by participating in outings, visiting local shops and restaurants, and seeing friends while getting the support and care they need to be as independent as possible at the home. Adult Day Training

The Adult Day Training offers vocational and prevocational opportunities through the art-based program. The program participants are able to develop skills that will help them gain more independence with the hopes of active employment in the future.

Summer Day Camp/PNO

Angelwood provides parents of school-aged children with intellectual and developmental differences and their elementary aged siblings some off-time during the year through the Summer Day Camp and Parents Night Out program. This is a great opportunity for parents to get some much needed time off while trained staff and volunteers engage their children in fun activities and provide for interaction with peers.

Supported Employment services are designed to assist individuals who are seeking competitive employment in the community. The Angelwood Thrift Store helps individuals build skills and prepares them for more independent community employment.

Angelwood serves over 325 individuals and their families each year.



We have a fleet of 8 vehicles which log over 26,000 miles a year transporting participants.



Our five group homes are more than just a place to live. We help with personal care, daily living skills, and community integration. We also have lots of FUN at home and in the community!



Participants at Angelwood's Adult Day Training Program create art that is sold in the community and they receive a portion of the proceeds.



Around 67% of Angelwood's annual budget is covered by Medicaid reimbursements and state funding. The balance must be raised through grants, foundations, individual donors, and fundraising events.



We have over 80 employees across our many programs and services. They go above and beyond every day to ensure the people we serve are safe, healthy, and have opportunities for growth and learning.



In 2024 our caring community generously gave 3,121 volunteer hours with an estimated value of \$91,788.61!

the senior staff and being there to discuss leadership skills and life goals they want to accomplish. Each time I volunteer I feel as though my life is also enriched. There are so many ways to contribute to Angelwood.
