With each new day, our individuals grow and develop new abilities, whether it's learning to collaborate, trying out vocational skills, or simply finding new ways to shine. Thirty three years after Angelwood opened its doors, our day training center remains at the heart of what we do. When Sally Fox founded Angelwood in 1993, she had a simple but powerful vision: every person deserves a safe, loving place to call home. As a Jacksonville news anchor and single mother raising two daughters with developmental differences, Sally understood something profound—a home isn't just four walls and a roof. It's where you belong. It's where you're known. It's where you can truly be yourself.

That same year, Angelwood opened its first group home, and for more than three decades, these homes have been providing stability, care, and community to those we serve.

A Legacy of Love and Stability

The depth of commitment in our group homes is perhaps best illustrated by the remarkable longevity of our residents' stays. We have residents who have been with Angelwood from inception—from when we first opened our doors thirty-three years ago—while others have celebrated twenty-five years with us. Think about that for a moment. In a world where change is constant and consistency can be hard to find, these residents have had the gift of stability, continuity, and a place to call home for decades.

Our 24-hour staff share in the daily rhythms of life, from morning coffee to evening routines. They celebrate birthdays, comfort during difficult times, and cheer on every achievement, no matter how small it might seem to the outside world.

Where Everyone Belongs

Located in residential neighborhoods throughout Jacksonville, our five group homes blend seamlessly into the fabric of the community. This is intentional. Our residents aren't set apart—they're woven into their neighborhoods, waving to familiar faces on morning walks, attending local events, and

building connections that make life rich and meaningful.

Inside these homes, dignity and respect are lived realities. Each resident is supported in developing independence while having the security of round-the-clock care. The goal is always the same: helping each person reach their unique potential while honoring who they are right now.

The mission Sally Fox began with remains unchanged: ensuring that everyone has a place where they truly belong.

For our residents, their group home is exactly what it should be—home in the fullest, most joyful sense of the word. It's a place filled with friendship, laughter, and the comfort of knowing you belong. And that's the beautiful reality we continue to create, one home, one person, one day at a time.




Summer Camp 2025

Volunteer Spotlight: Sharon Dowe

Twenty Years of Giving Back and Making a Difference



Twenty years ago, I was simply a working mother searching for summer care for my daughter Danielle. Then I found Angelwood—a community that understood our journey, celebrated our daughter, and gave our family a place to belong.

As a full-time professional and parent of a child with disabilities, every day presented its own unique challenges. When we discovered Angelwood's Summer Camp program, it felt like someone had

finally turned on the lights. Here was a place where dignity and respect are woven into every interaction, every activity, every moment of care.

Danielle participated in that summer program until she aged out at 22, and those summers gave us something priceless: hope, community, and the breathing room every family needs to thrive.

And something happened to me during those years. As I watched the staff love and nurture not just Danielle but hundreds of individuals with autism, cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, and spina bifida, I began to understand the profound ripple effect of this organization. Angelwood wasn't just serving individuals with disabilities—they were strengthening entire families, educating our community, and proving every single day that every person, regardless of ability, deserves to live with purpose and joy.

When I was invited to join Angelwood's Board of Directors, I said yes without hesitation. How could I not? This organization had given so much to our family. Soon I took on additional roles on the Program Committee and Thrift Store Committee, finding new ways to contribute to an organization that had so profoundly changed our lives. Before I retired from UBS, I had the privilege of sharing Angelwood's story with my colleagues, and their generosity overwhelmed me—furniture donations for our various locations, sponsorships, matching gifts. It reinforced what I already knew: when people truly understand what Angelwood does, they want to be part of it.

Over these past two decades, I've volunteered thousands of hours—at events, in our thrift store, on various projects—and I can tell you this: every single hour has given back to me tenfold.

Earlier this year, I had the opportunity to speak with Kent Justice from WJXT about our family's journey and what

Angelwood means to families like ours.

While sharing our story, I realized something powerful: In addition to being a grateful parent, I am an advocate and an ambassador. A believer in the transformative power of organizations that see people—truly see them and meet them exactly where they are.

But here's what I want you to know: Angelwood runs on people who care. Staff members who show up with their whole hearts. Board members who dream about what's possible. Donors who believe in the mission. And volunteers—beautiful, generous volunteers, who give their time because they understand that building a more inclusive, compassionate community takes all of us.

When you volunteer at Angelwood, you're doing more than filling a shift or checking a box. You're becoming part of someone's story. You're helping a mother breathe easier knowing her child is safe. You're showing a young adult with a disability that he/she has value and potential. You're proving to our community that how we treat our most vulnerable citizens is the true measure of who we are.

Danielle and I have had the privilege over these past two decades to meet so many wonderful people who help make our lives and the lives of hundreds of others, a little bit easier. So many beautiful memories. So much gratitude.

Now I'm asking you to join us. Whether you have a few hours a month or a few hours a week, whether you want to help at events, work in our thrift store, or serve on a committee, we need you. Your compassion, your time, your unique gifts—they matter more than you know.
